Proscriptive Dress Code

The following items may **not** be worn in the Waterloo Community Schools:

PANTS / SKIRTS / DRESSES / BOTTOMS

- Any type of cargo or carpenter bottoms with large pockets attached to the exterior
- Any type of sweat pants/athletic uniform bottoms/shorts or similar clothing
- Bottoms of any type of material, i.e. knit, flannel, denim, nylon, spandex, or similar, that are form-fitting to the body
- Skateboard pants, stirrup pants, jeggings, or similar
- Leggings worn as pants without additional bottom/top at knee length in PK-grade 5
- Leggings in grades 6-12
- Any type of jeans or overalls
- Any bottoms with prints, patterns, embroidery, colored trim, words, symbols, decoration, or chains, large brand tags, or similar
- Bottoms whose lengths are above the knee
- Pajamas or other clothing meant to be worn as sleep wear
- Bottoms in any shade of green, yellow, light blue medium blue, red, orange, purple, or white
- Bottoms with holes, rips, or voids
- Bottoms that permit undergarments to be visible
- Bottoms that are revealing or undersized (too tight)
- Bottoms that are more than one size too large (too loose)
- Bottoms whose waist is worn more than one inch below the natural waistline
- Bottoms that have belt loops that are worn without a belt in grades 3-12
- Bottoms that are sheer or see-through
- Bottoms that drag on the floor

SHIRTS / TOPS / DRESSES

- Tops that are without collars
- Tops that are sleeveless or capped-sleeved
- Tops that are t-shirts, except school t-shirts on designated days
- Tops that are school athletic or activity apparel, except by members of recognized school groups on designated days
- Tops that are halters, tanks, tubes, bare midribs, spaghetti-straped, backless, and/or off-the-shoulder, or similar
- Tops that are revealing
- Tops that are hooded
- Tops that have holes, rips, or voids
- Tops that allow undergarments to be visible
- Tops that are worn un-tucked
- Tops that are tight or too loose (Plus or minus more than one size)
- Tops that have a logo larger than 1" (whose height or width is more than 1") except for Waterloo school-specific logos
- Tops that are sheer or see-through
- Tops that are frayed

FOOTWEAR

- Sandals or similar
- Crocs or similar
- Flip flops or similar
- Open-toed shoes
- Shoes with heels above two inches or similar
- Slippers or house shoes/house boots, or similar
- Shoes with fabric soles
- Any shoe not meant for outdoor wear
- Wheelie/Heely shoes (shoes with skates in the bottom)
- Any shoe with a spiked heel

HEADWEAR

- Hats, visors, caps, bandanas, do-rags/wraps, hairnets, scarves or similar
- Sunglasses, unless prescribed by a physician for indoor use

BELTS

- Belts with buckles whose heights are more than the approximate heights of the belt
- Belts with excessive metal (more metal than is necessary for the functioning of the belt)
- Chains or chain belts
- Belts with studs (i.e. metal or rhinestones or similar)
- Belts with any types of protruding objects
- Belts with words or graphics that are disruptive, distracting or offensive in language or symbols in grades PK-5.
- Belts with words or graphics in grades 6-12.
- Belts with excess buttons, extra zippers, things extra hanging off the belt, or similar object(s)

JACKETS/SWEATERS/VESTS/SWEATSHIRTS/OUTDOOR WEIGHT SCARVES/GLOVES

Any outdoor apparel is not permitted in classrooms, hallways, or common areas other than passage to and from the student's locker or coat room upon arrival to or departure from the main building. The following lighter weight jackets, fleeces, sweaters, vests, and sweatshirts may not be worn in the Waterloo Community School District classrooms, hallways, or common areas during the school day:

- Those with plaids, checks, stripes, patterns, embroidery, decorations, words, graphics, colored trims, printed designs, or similar
- Those with excess buttons, extra zippers, things hanging off the clothing, or similar extras
- Hooded garments
- Garments with holes, rips, or voids
- Garments that are fringed
- Jackets/sweaters/sweatshirts/fleeces without a collared shirt underneath
- Items with logos larger than 1" in width or length, except Waterloo School specific logo apparel

LAYERED CLOTHING

The following clothing, usually worn as a layer under other clothing, may not be worn in the Waterloo Community Schools:

- Any t-shirts, camies, or tanks, unless underneath approved tops (the combination may not be collarless)
- Those with any shades of plaid, checks, stripes, printed designs, words, or symbols
- Any tights, pantyhose, or nylons that are not neutral-colored or that are of one of the prohibited bottom colors: any shade of medium or light blue, green, yellow, red, orange, purple, or white, in grades 6-12
- Tights of fishnet fabric
- Tights with any patterns, stripes, plaids, designs, words, or symbols in grades 6-12
- Leggings or footless tights in grades 6-12

ACCESSORIES

- Bandanas or visible handkerchiefs
- Jewelry that could be used as a weapon
- Excessive jewelry (jewelry that is distracting or poses a safety hazard)

OTHER

It is not permissible to wear any item that may be used as a weapon, including, but not limited to, steel-toed shoes/boots, chains, items with spikes or studs, and other items deemed inappropriate by the principal. It is not permissible to wear any item that indicates affiliation with a gang.

IMPLEMENTATION

This policy applies to all elementary, middle and high school students and will be implemented district-wide beginning with the 2011-2012 school year.* Any school in the district that is already implementing the Standardized Dress Code 504.2 (all high schools, alternative programs, Lincoln Elementary, and Kittrell Elementary) began this policy on January 3, 2011.

ADDITIONAL SCHOOL-SPECIFIC RULES

Each school site may develop, with the approval of the district dress code committee, additional rules which are more restrictive than the District Dress Code policy and regulation, but shall not permit items prohibited herein. Schools are responsible for notifying their students and parents/guardians in a timely manner of their building's additional Dress Code rules.

EXCEPTIONS

Exceptions to the Dress Code will be made for students with IEPs, religious beliefs, JROTC uniforms, or health conditions that require accommodations.

REGULATION

The superintendent will develop regulations to implement this policy.

SAVINGS CLAUSE

In the event that any administrative or judicial body declares any portion of this policy or any attending regulation illegal, the remaining portion of this policy or attending regulation not declared illegal shall remain in full force and effect without further action by the District.

West High Academic Hall of Fame to Honor Three Alumni

On September 9, 2011, three West High alumni will be inducted into the West High Academic Hall of Fame in conjunction with Homecoming Week festivities. The three honorees will be introduced at the Homecoming Pep Assembly, treated to lunch with family and friends, ride in convertibles during the Homecoming parade, and be introduced at the football game. The three individuals who will be inducted during the 3rd Annual Hall of Fame Ceremonies include:

Mr. David Greene, class of 1943: Mr. Greene enlisted in the United States Marine Corps following graduation. As a radio man in the service, he fought in World War II, including fighting in the Battle of Iwo Jima. After the war, Mr. Greene worked for the engineering firm of Jens Olesen & Sons for 36 years until his retirement. Mr. Greene has been a noted community leader and volunteer including active involvement in the Boys Scouts, the Sullivan Brothers Iowa Veterans Museum, and many other civic organizations in Waterloo. He has been described as a true American hero.

Mr. James Young, class of 1954: Mr. Young earned three graduate degrees from the University of Iowa, including a Bachelor of Arts degree, a law degree, and a Ph.D in Political Science. After college, Mr. Young taught Political Science at both St. Olaf College and University of Central Missouri, culminating as a Professor Emeritus of Political Science at UCM. During his professional career, Mr. Young also published and contributed to several books and articles related to law and political science. In addition, he has been an active community volunteer.

Mr. Dale Anderson, class of 1964: Mr. Anderson received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Michigan State, a law degree from the University of Virginia, and a Ph.D. from Michigan State. After college, Mr. Anderson worked as a prosecutor for Tucson, Arizona, taught constitutional and criminal procedures at Thomas Cooley School of Law and Michigan State, as well as becoming Senior Partner in his own law firm. Following these achievements, Mr. Anderson went on to become the counsel to Speaker of the House J. Dennis Hastert, U.S. Congress.

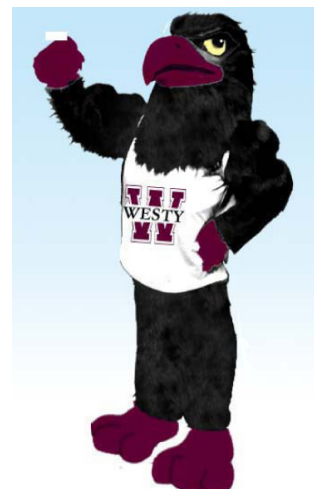
Student Sports Passes

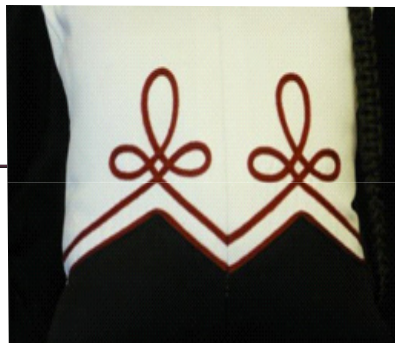
