In October, students had the opportunity to attend the annual West High Career Fair in the West High gymnasium. Approximately 50 businesses and colleges contributed booths to the West High Career Fair, and students were able to visit the booths to learn more about these colleges and businesses.

The leadership team and teachers at West High also made an effort during the first semester to establish connections and learn more about the careers available to students today. In November, academy leadership teams met with the Advisory Committees. These committees are composed of representatives from local businesses and colleges, and the meetings allow the committee members to stay informed about how the academies are developing at West. The Advisory Committee meetings also allow the West leadership team and teachers to hear about what kinds of skills and qualities colleges and businesses are looking for today.

Finally, in September and again in November, West teachers spent the morning touring local businesses and establishments in order to learn more about how they operate and what kinds of skills their employees must have. A few of the local businesses and establishments the teachers visited include John Deere, the Black Hawk County Court House, the Mauer Eye Center, and the Waterloo Center for the Arts.

Counselors will be distributing materials and information through classroom presentations for both the 9th and the 10th grade classes. Students are asked to bring this information home to share and confer with their parents. They should then be prepared to register by the end of their week with their classes.

### Registration for 11th grade students:

On January 11, all 11th grade students attended an assembly to hear about registration for next year. They were given a transcript of their grades, a course selection sheet and an appointment slip for their individual senior year planning appointment. During their individual appointment they should be prepared to select their courses for 2012-13. Parents are very welcome to attend with their students. Ask your junior when his/her appointment with his/her counselor is scheduled.

### Additional registration information:

West High students have the opportunity to take concurrent classes at West High for Hawkeye Community College credit. In order to be certified to take these free classes, a student must have taken the COMPASS test and received scores of Reading-82, Writing-65, Algebra -42 or have taken the ACT and received a score of 19 in the English, Math and Science subtests. Once the student has the appropriate scores he/she must sign up with Hawkeye College. This registration will occur at West High on March 7 and March 21. Both registration times are 1:15 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. This is a mandated registration session, so students must attend one of the sessions in order to take the college courses. ## American Heart Month

Hopefully you have each made at least one commitment to be healthier this coming year. February is "American Heart Month". Heart disease is the leading cause of death in the United States and is a major cause of disability. The most common heart disease in the United States is coronary heart disease, which often appears as a heart attack. In 2010, an estimated 785,000 Americans had a new coronary attack, and about 470,000 had a recurrent attack. About every 25 seconds, an American will have a coronary event, and about one every minute will die from one.

The chance of developing coronary heart disease can be reduced by taking steps to prevent and control factors that put people at greater risk.

A healthy diet and lifestyle are the best weapons you have to fight heart disease. It is important to remember that it is the overall pattern of the choices you make that counts. Tobacco smoke can cause health problems not only for smokers, but also for people around them. Breathing secondhand smoke increases a person's risk for a heart attack and other heart conditions.

Additionally, knowing the signs and symptoms of a heart attack are crucial to the most positive outcomes after having a heart attack. Signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- \* Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness, or pain.

- \* Discomfort in other areas of the upper body. Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw, or stomach.

- \* Shortness of breath. This may occur with or without chest discomfort.

- \* Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea, or lightheadedness.
